

Rocky Mountain Chapter Of National Academy Of Television Arts And Sciences Names Silver Circle Inductees

The Rocky Mountain Southwest Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences (NATAS) announces its 2016 honorees for the Silver Circle Society.

Silver Circle recipients include:

- John Booth, of Tucson, the executive producer of Arizona Public Media who has more than 30 years of experience in the media;
- Joe Diaz, of Albuquerque, who has spent almost three decades with Action 7 as the News Chief Meteorologist;
- Deborah Sedillo Dugan, of Cave Creek, PHXTV station manager;
- John Hook, of Scottsdale, who has spent 32 of his 33 years in broadcasting in Arizona and has worked with the FOX10 News team since August 1993;
- Morgan Loew, of Ahwatukee, an investigative reporter for CBS 5 whose reporting career has taken him to every corner of the state and many corners of the U.S. and the globe; and
- Todd Walsh, of Scottsdale, a 13-time Emmy Award winner who has been honored as the best sports anchor three times and has worked with FOX Sports Arizona since 2001.

Honorees will be inducted into the society during the Emmy Gala at Talking Stick Resort on October 8.

The chapter established its Silver Circle Society in 1992. To be eligible for the Silver Circle honor, individuals must have served in the broadcast industry for a minimum of 25 years. Nominations are accepted from broadcast journalism, talent, creative, technical, administrative, as well as TV commercial production and TV education.
